

2022 World Double-bit Axe Throwing Championships

Maritime pre-qualifiers UPDATED

The 2022 World Double-bit Axe Throwing Championships will bring the best double-bit axe throwers in the world to Barrington, Nova Scotia, Canada August 26-28 to compete for world titles in Men's, Women's, Youth and Teams divisions. Spots are limited to 150 competitors in total across all divisions, therefore to make the event accessible to as many international athletes travelling to Canada as possible, all residents of the Maritime provinces of Canada must pre-qualify for the 2022 World Championships.

36 spots will be guaranteed (18 men and 18 women) for axe throwers who are residents of the Maritime provinces and these spots will be determined through 3 pre-qualifier competitions.

Pre-qualifiers will be held at the following dates and locations:

1. Sunday June 12, 2022 – Moncton, New Brunswick, Timber Lounge
 - *5 Men and 5 Women will qualify*
 - ***Restricted to New Brunswick and PEI residents***
2. Sunday June 19, 2022 – Dartmouth, Nova Scotia, Timber Lounge
 - *5 Men and 5 Women will qualify*
 - ***Restricted to Nova Scotia residents***
3. Saturday July 9 & Sunday July 10 – Barrington, Nova Scotia, Wild Axe Park
 - *8 Men and 8 Women will qualify*
 - ***Open to all Maritime residents***

➤ **If you do not qualify at either the Moncton or Dartmouth qualifiers, you are eligible to compete again in Barrington at the Open qualifier to attempt to qualify again**

Competition format: Lowest scoring throwers will be eliminated after each round and top scorers move on.

- i. Opening Round – 24 throws
- ii. Quarter Final – 12 throws
- iii. Semi-final – 6 throws
- iv. Final – Knockout elimination

Additional Details:

- Pre-registration is required (details to follow).
- Registration fee of \$25 per thrower (pay on arrival).
- Must follow public health & safety guidelines.
- Scoring and subsequent rankings from pre-qualifiers will be used to choose additional throwers to compete at World Championships should “wildcard” spots be available closer to the event
